



# Digital Council

30 September 2021

The Digital Council met for the first time on 30 September. The Council has been established to oversee the development of the HFMA's Delivering value with digital technologies programme, by helping to shape its contents and ensuring that the outputs are high quality.

Its members include finance, clinical, operational and informatics staff working in the NHS with an interest in digital transformation, as well as representatives from Health Education England, NHSX, NHS England and NHS Improvement, and the Federation for Informatics Professionals in Health and Social Care.

The Council reviewed the programme, noting the importance of collaborative working between finance, clinicians and informatics when delivering digital transformation. The discussion included the need for financial frameworks to enable digital transformation, the importance of workforce planning to take account of the impact of digital technology, and how effective change management was required to ensure benefits are realised.
